
The main salon is an inviting area below deck, where you can relax on the sofa with a good book or challenge your partner to a game of chess at the game table.

Our three guest staterooms each have a double bed, as well as closet and ample drawer space. Two of these staterooms have an additional sofa and a desk area.
















Few places have the power to evoke such exotic imagery as the Islands of Indonesia.




The Komodo National Park, a protected UNESCO World Heritage Site, is the only known habitat of the Komodo dragon, the world's largest monitor lizard.




